As a special surprise, the BWGA purchased and donated 100 DVD copies of "The Next Step...Restorative Exercises after Breast Cancer" for AIBH to give to their patients. The innovative concept was developed by Nancy Hewitt, a veteran producer and friend of a Boulder's member, who partnered with certified cancer exercise specialist Lisa Gulotta to launch a gentle, custom exercise program for women during their breast cancer journey.

"There is no other non-profit organization in the country like AIBH," said Dr. Coral Ouiet of Arizona Breast Cancer Specialists, cofounder of AIBH. "This unique medical panel was formed by a consortium

of medical professionals who are breast cancer experts. ABIH was created to give women the opportunity to receive information and education about the best possible treatment for their specific breast cancer." The Institute strongly believes in providing women, "options before decisions".

"More than 4000 women in Arizona will be diagnosed with breast cancer this year," said Cohen. "We are proud to help raise funds that directly help our local women in their time of need."
